## **Week Two – Class 1- God’s Guidance: A Look at Sarah**

- I. Sarah: God’s woman in spite of herself. Genesis 11:29-30
  - A. From an honored family in Ur of the Chaldees, married Abram, her half-brother.
  - B. First historical woman of the Jewish people, through whom all nations would be blessed.
  - C. Listed in the Hall of Faith in Hebrews 11:11-12
- II. Sarah: The danger of running ahead of God; she realized her mistake but it was too late.
  - A. God had promised seed (children) to Abraham and Sarah but she was barren.
  - B. She gave Hagar, her handmaid, to have a child; Ishmael was born to her and Abraham
  - C. She realized her mistake but it was too late. Suffering continues today because of her sin.
- III. Finding the Lord’s Will: God will guide us. Psalm 37
  - A. God has a plan or blueprint for every life. It is possible to miss it.
  - B. Conditions of guidance: Trust, Delight, Commit, Rest, and Surrender to His will.
  - C. Your mind must be in tune with God as He speaks through His Spirit, His Word, and a still small voice.
- IV. Methods of Guidance. No set pattern; He deals with each person differently. He speaks through:
  - A. Scripture: His will is NEVER contrary to His word!
  - B. Inner conviction by the Holy Spirit. Holy Spirit is our guide.
  - C. Circumstances: God uses them to close one door and to open another. Do not arrange it!
  - D. Ask yourself: Is it the voice of my own desires or is it what God wants me to do?
  - E. Guidance is often a combination of several factors. You only need light for one step at a time. Follow and obey the God in the light that He has given and then He will give you further light.

  - C. She deceives, schemes, and manipulates to achieve her goal but loses all that matters to her.

- II. Job’s wife: Discourage -defined- to prevent, obstruct, stop, hinder, depress, or to dishearten.
  - A. She is called the hateful helpmeet. Job 2:9,10, 19:17.
  - B. “Woman who urged her husband to commit suicide” (Lockyer)
  - C. “A woman who failed to communicate with her husband” (Price)
  - D. She tried to discourage Job from his victory of faith.
- III. Living in Christian Victory is possible for every believer. I John 5:4
  - A. The promise of victory. I Corinthians 2:14, 10:13, Romans 6:14, 8:37.
  - B. The principle of victory: “By faith”. Romans 1:17, Galatians 3:11, Hebrews 10:38
  - C. The secret of victory. “Identification”. Colossians 1:27, Romans 6:4,6,8,10 & 13.
  - D. The choice of victory. Choose to let Christ live through you. Decisions determine destiny! Romans 6:16-22, Galatians 2:20.

  - B. Her selection: fulfilled prophecy; she was overwhelmed and praised the Lord.
  - C. Her submission: she asks questions of Gabriel who explains the miracle; she submits.
  - D. Her service: after Jesus was born she mothered him for 30 years, she was humble and obedient.
  - E. Her later years: seeing her Son rejected and later stood by the cross as He suffered.

  - A. Put everything in God's hands and trust Him to take care of it all.

  - A. It is received from parents, they from their parents; continuing to the creation of man.
  - B. God formed man and gave him life. Genesis 2:7
  - C. All life comes from God. I John 5:20
- II. Kinds of life – Bible speaks of three types:
  - A. Physical – given at creation of man.
  - B. Spiritual – a gift from God to the believer in Christ. Ephesians 2:1
  - C. Eternal – Nature and characteristic of the Lord God; given to His children. John 10:28
- III. Length of life:
  - A. Life span before the flood – 846 years
  - B. After the flood life span reduced to 393 years.
  - C. Psalm 90:10 – it is 70 years. A short time – Job 14:1 Psalm 89:47. Life quickly vanishes – James 4:13-15.
- IV. Purpose of Life:
  - A. A moment of time in which to prepare for eternity.
  - B. Time to choose the abiding place of your soul. Heaven or Hell – no neutral ground.
  - C. To have communion with God and to serve Him after salvation.
- V. Deborah – A servant of God. Judges 4 & 5
  - A. A woman of great faith in God, gifted in wisdom.
  - B. She encouraged an entire nation. A ruler – the 4<sup>th</sup> Judge, she served 40 years.
  - C. A maternal figure but a warrior by necessity.
- VI. Lot's Wife – A woman chained to her past. Genesis 19:26, Luke 17:32
  - A. Her husband was affluent.
  - B. Her influence on her children.
  - C. A permanent symbol of disobedience to the warning of God.

- I. Bathsheba - Her beauty resulted in adultery and murder. II Samuel 11,12, I Kings 1 & 2
  - A. Her involvement in the sin with David – Should have been more modest, no remorse.
  - B. Her child died by Divine judgement for sin.
  - C. She was the mother of Solomon, “Beloved of the Lord”.
  - D. Sin did not ruin her entire life; she became wise, virtuous, and a good mother.
- II. Woman of Samaria – She left her water pot. John 4
  - A. Her individuality: She was an alien as far as the Jews were concerned.
  - B. Her iniquity: Living in open sin with a man who was not her husband.
  - C. Her ignorance: Not knowing the spiritual truth of a deep well of forgiveness.
  - D. Her conversion: She became a great witness for Christ after her conversion.
- III. What is sin? “transgression of a religious or moral law; especially when deliberate”
  - A. An act, a state, or a nature which is the lack of conformity to the character of God.
  - B. Characteristic of the old nature, the flesh.
  - C. Originated with Satan; entered the world through Adam. Isaiah 14:12-14, Rom. 5:12
  - D. Results: Death, punishment, guilt, condemnation, and hell. Rom. 6:23, Rev. 20:14

  - A. Her sanctity – a woman of unblemished character who lived for the Lord is her trouble.
  - B. Her sorrow – she was childless and of a sorrowful spirit because of barrenness.
  - C. Her supplication – she poured out her soul to God vowing to give God her son
  - D. Hearing her prayer would be answered; she away just believed God. Verse 18
- II. Salome – the mother who wanted the best for her sons. Matthew 20:20-24, Mark 10:35-40.
  - A. The wife of Zebedee, a prosperous fisherman who had servants.
  - B. She was a devoted follower of Christ.
  - C. Ambitious for her sons, she confused worldly positions with spiritual greatness.
  - D. Jesus gently rebukes her as He teaches that spiritual greatness must be earned by sacrifice.
- III. Developing greatness and self-confidence in your child.
  - A. Be a praying mother like Hannah.
  - B. Be a servant like Salome, learn lessons from the Lord’s teachings.
  - C. Learn to accept yourself and be content. Hebrews 13:5
  - D. Teach them to be “God-sufficient” not “self-sufficient”. II Corinthians 3:5, 12:6-9

Romans 16:3, I Corinthians 16:19, II Timothy 4:19
- A. They were one in material bliss; they were inseparable.
  - B. They were one in the Lord ‘ and in their knowledge of Scripture.
  - C. They were one in secular occupation.
  - D. They were one in their friendship with Paul.
  - E. They were one in the service of the Church.
- II. Becoming one with your husband. Ephesians 5:22-24
- A. Take his needs, feelings, and desires into yourself in a spirit of love.
  - B. Remember it is a lifetime commitment; work daily to enjoy your time together.
  - C. Total trust combined with love for him; only possible through surrender to self to “oneness” with him.
  - D. The key: fulfill the biblical command of submission – nothing is impossible with God!
  - E. “Wife can be the neck that turns the head” (Spurgeon). Virtuous wife is a crown to him. Proverbs 12:4
- III. Submission: encourages love, which in turn encourages submission.
- A. It is an attitude before it is an act.
  - B. Unconditional; based entirely upon the command of God.
  - C. Voluntarily giving oneself to the place God has ordained.
  - D. Requires wisdom from God. I Corinthians 11:3
  - E. Refusal to submit expresses a lack of faith in God.

  - B. The most beautiful of all maidens presented to the King.
  - C. She obeyed her foster-father and was used of God to save her people from destruction.
  - D. She served with fearlessness, intelligence, deep insight, and prudence.
  - E. Her memory lives; Esther is read annually in March in Jewish synagogues all over the world. Chapter 9: 18-32
- II. Lessons learned from the of character Esther:
  - A. Seek Divine guidance in times of difficulty. Chapter 4:15-17
  - B. Renounce self, if necessary, and exert ourselves for the good of others.
  - C. Value and seek the cooperation of fellow-believers.
  - D. Complete confidence in God's providence – not to undervalue small things.
  - E. Acknowledge God as the Author of all mercies.
- III. Dorcas, *Tabitha*, a Christian woman full of good works.
  - A. She had great compassion on the needy of her church and community.
  - B. A sewing needle as her tool and her home as her workshop, she established a service that continues today through the Dorcas Sewing Societies, named in her honor.
  - C. She died in the midst of a useful life, she was mourned and missed by those she had served.
  - D. She was raised from the dead and was the cause of revival. Acts 9:42
  - E. From her we learn: Do whatever our hand finds to do, as unto the Lord.
- IV. Faith: How to put it into action. Titus 3:3-8, Ephesians 2:10
  - A. Obedience and service are proof of genuine faith
  - B. Meaning- **F**orsaking, **A**ll, **I**, **T**rust, **H**im – He will guide me!
  - C. See the need! Opportunities abound to serve God and a needy world.
  - D. Serve in love; follow the example of Jesus.
  - E. Grow in faith, root yourself in Christ and His Word, and pray in faith as you go with God.
- V. True faith requires action. Adjustments prepare for obedience. Adjustments may be required in:
  - A. Circumstances (job, home, finances, or other areas of your life).
  - B. Relationships (family, friends, business associates, or others).
  - C. Thinking
  - D. Commitments
  - E. Actions: What you do tells what you believe about God!

  - E. Jealousy and ambition were drawback to her otherwise commanding character.
- II. Sapphira: The woman who dropped dead. Acts 5:1-11
  - A. She and her husband Ananias were professing Christians.
  - B. Their professed discipleship aggravated their sin.
  - C. Christians were selling what they had and giving all to take care of every ones needs; they pretended a similar surrender.
  - D. These great pretenders sold a plot of land and lied about the size of their gift.
  - E. Judgement was swift and severe. Death as a result of sin.
